

A “Rocky Mountain High” Welcome for Mother Patricia Mary

Mother Patricia Mary, arriving in Denver for the first time, was greeted with a true western welcome! Residents and staff, outfitted in traditional cowboy gear of straw hats and colorful bandanas, gave her a hearty, down-home hello. As she stepped from the car and made her way toward the entrance, those who could kick up their heels broke into a rip-roaring western line dance. And, of course, to complete the greeting, everyone joined in and sang John Denver’s celebratory hit, “Rocky Mountain High”. Gradually, Mother made her way through the

welcoming crowd getting acquainted with new names and faces of staff and Residents.

The following day, accompanied by Mother Provincial Maria Christine Joseph, Mother Patricia Mary was entertained by an original, informative play, “Memories”. Written by Debbie Miller in the Activities Department and performed by selected Residents and staff members, the play introduced Mother to the history of our Home from its beginnings in 1916. A real crowd pleaser was the “appearance” of the Home’s original benefactors, J.K. Mullen

and his wife, Catherine, who offered to finance the Home in 1911. Historical highlights throughout the presentation were given musical accompaniment by pianist John Nadeu and the Home’s chimes ensemble which is made up of Residents and volunteers. Root beer floats were served to a very satisfied and appreciative audience.



"Old Tom Is Calling It a Day" -- March 27, 1935

"Old Tom is going to take it easy from now on, because he's worked for so long a time, pulling a wagon around Denver's streets for the Home for the Aged, managed by the Little Sisters of the Poor. A motor truck is to do the work in the future. It will collect all articles donated to the home and Old Tom, the fine, faithful old horse, will have nothing to do but grow older, and to do it gracefully. The horse is shown here, with the motor truck, his driver, Joe Wolff, and the dog, Beauty, a boon companion." --Denver Post

Our tradition of begging is as essential today as it was when our dear foundress, Saint Jeanne Jugan, began her daily begging rounds in 1839 in Saint Servan, France. She gathered food, clothing, and other provisions for the elderly poor Residents she had taken into her home.
