Dear Families and Friends of our Mullen Home Residents,

With the challenges the Home has faced over the past months related to the Home's COVID outbreak, we are happy to report we are moving in the direction of ending the outbreak. We have been working so hard to try to keep the residents, staff and visitors safe with mitigating risk of spreading the virus.

We continue to update the State Department of Health on any newly identified COVID cases among staff or residents. We continue to work closely with the State Department of Health with any required infection control assessments, guidance and recommendations in order to make the Home as safe as possible for all. Individuals are encouraged to get vaccinated and boosted if eligible, remain at least 6 feet from others whenever possible, wash or sanitize their hands and wear proper face coverings to reduce the likelihood of disease transmission.

Over the past few weeks, Denver County has experienced a spike in COVID cases. As we continue to combat COVID-19 in our community and around the Nation, we are required to continue some limited requirements to mitigate the spread of the disease. We have fully opened our Home over the past months to visitors and we pray we will be able to welcome them in for the sake of our beloved residents. The families have been so patient and supportive during the entire pandemic and continue to support the Home.

The Home has held its 3rd COVID booster clinic here in the Home on 5/4/22 for all residents and staff who had a desire to receive any dose of the COVID vaccine, which included booster doses if they were eligible. We continue to educate residents, staff and visitors on the importance of the COVID vaccine and the booster in order to protect themselves.

As a reminder, the use of source control for visitors remain based on the Home's County Community Transmission Level, as well as the visitor and the resident's vaccination status as outlined in the Residential Care Facility Comprehensive Mitigation Guidance.

While visiting the Home, please be sure to view the "Visitor Guidelines" which are posted all throughout the Home. The Home's "Visitor Guidelines" will show what visitation looks like for visitors based on the Home's current County Community Transmission Level.
